Logistical Information

There is no registration fee for staff from local domestic violence/sexual assault programs and tribal domestic violence/sexual assault programs. <u>There is a \$30 registration fee for organizations</u> who are not members of the Coalition in order to cover the costs of materials. Payment must be made prior to the training (by January 28) and can be mailed to the Coalition. Please call if you need to make other arrangements.

Participants are responsible for all other costs associated with the training (i.e., mileage, hotel accommodations, meal costs). Due to Department of Justice grant guidelines, the Coalition is not able to provide beverages or snacks of any kind. There are vending machines available and several restaurants nearby.

A total of 36 training hours are provided, most of which qualify for CEUs. The training content meets the continuing education requirements for mental health, marriage/family therapists, and social work as defined by the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services, Regulation and Licensure.

Please note that the primary audience of this training is staff and volunteers of local domestic violence and sexual assault programs. However, the training is open to other organizations wishing to enhance their response to victims and survivors of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault and stalking.
